OLD BUSINESS:

1. - 4. A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to authorize the advertisement for bids for the Green Light Go Grant improvements as recommended by the Township Engineer. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried.2-0
- 5. A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to make an offer of employment to <u>Jesse Bails</u> for the part-time position of Building and Grounds Maintenance Employee at the rate of <u>\$16.00 per hour</u> as recommended by the Township Manager and Director of Public Works, conditional on successful passing of a drug screening. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried.2-0
- A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to establish a 2020 Census Complete Count Program as recommended by the Washington Planning Commission and adopt Resolution R-9-2019 accordingly. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0

- A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to enter into a pest control maintenance agreement with <u>Terminex</u> in the amount of <u>\$1,050.00</u> as recommended by the Parks and Recreation Director in accordance with the 2019 Budget. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0
- A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to enter into an agreement for Right of Entry with <u>Consol Mining Company, LLC</u> of <u>Canonsburg</u>, <u>PA</u> to effectuate the road repair of Arden Road as recommended by the Project Engineer. the Township Manager to advertise. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried 2-0
- 3. A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to authorize payment of invoices(General Fund: Checks #33676-33701:\$106,545.77; Act 13 Impact Fee Fund: Check #1036: \$31,170.00; Sanitary Sewer Fund; Checks #1250-1252: \$3,901.74; Capital Reserve Fund: Checks #1088-1090: \$1.212.00; CTCC Fund: Checks # 1476-1478: \$2,332.10; Revenue Gaming Fund: Check # 1040: \$676.36; Local Service Tax Fund: Check # 1101: \$117.52; Fire Tax Fund: Check # 1001: \$9,600.47; Total All Funds: \$155,555.76). DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- <u>1st Quarter Interim Financial Statements</u> The Township Manager presented the 1st Quarter Financial status. The Township is realizing positive trends for the first quarter. Revenues are comparatively on-track or better and expenditures are ontrack or lower at this point of 2019.
- McClane Farms Road Sewer Project The Project Engineer submitted the final documentation to DEP. When DEP responds finalizes the project and reduces the Debt Service that the Township is paying the resident debt service will be recalculated for a reduction in the current rate.
- 3. <u>2019 Road Program, specifically Contract B: Museum Road</u> Joe Sites of Gateway is researching alternate access to expedite bids for the project.
- 4. <u>2019 Sewer Rehabilitation Project</u> The Township Engineer has the project ready to go and will get information to Mrs. Noble. Bids will be advertised for the lining portion of the project.
- 5. <u>CHJA Rate Increase/Act 537 Plan</u> The Township Solicitor reported that mediation is scheduled for May 7, 2019.
- 6. February Storm Events/Flooding Follow Up -
 - Road Damage
 - Arden Mines Road Slides– Gateway will provide a summary report on the core boring results.

- 7. <u>Veronica Drive Cul-de-sac Completion Request</u> Equipment is on-site and Public Works started work to complete the temporary base for the cul-de-sac.
- 8. <u>Arden Sewage Project/CDBG Grant</u> Gateway is waiting for response from DEP on outstanding issues.
- 9. <u>Allison Park Trail Repairs</u> On hold until school is out in June.
- 10. <u>Airport Road Bridge</u> Mr. Liekar will update the Board at the next meeting.
- 11. Welsh Road Drainage Repair On hold for the Dirt & Gravel Grant Opening.
- 12. <u>Ballfield Development/NPDES Permit</u> The requested extension is approved.
- Spring Clean Up Waste Management will conduct daily scheduled route curbside pick-up Monday – Friday, the week of May 20-24, 2019. Information will be on Facebook, Township Website and outdoor scrolling signs plus a One-Call to listed Township residents.
- 14. <u>Arnold Park Improvements</u> Public Works will have the concrete pad ready for the gazebo. The playground preparation is completed for the new equipment.
- 15. <u>False Alarm Ordinance Amendment</u> The Township Solicitor reviewed the draft and will have it ready for action at the May 14, 2019 meeting.
- 16.<u>Well Site Tour</u> Mrs. Noble is waiting for a confirmation date and time from Range Resources.
- 17. Keep Washington County Beautiful Road Clean-up –The Township Manager is procuring vests, gloves and trash bags from PennDot for the "Lead by Example" litter pick-up scheduled along Allison Hollow Road. Weather permitting, the Township Office will close at NOON, Friday, April 26, 2019 for Staff, Gateway Engineer Staff, and volunteers who wish to participate.
- 18. <u>Employee Insurance Options</u> Mrs. Noble presented for the Board's consideration of supplemental insurance through Colonial Insurance as an alternative to the current employee AFLAC plan. This will be discussed at a future meeting.

- 19. <u>Sewer RoW Foliage Maintenance</u> The Township Manager will give written response to the resident letter received about trees along the Sewer RoW falling and ready to fall onto his property. Property owners are responsible for foliage on the surface of the Right of Ways.
- 20.<u>645 McClane farm Road Water Drainage Complaint</u> addressed under Visitor's time at the beginning of this meeting.
- 21. No Jake Brake Sign Request -
 - A motion was made by Mr. Spin and seconded by Mr. Friend to forward the resident request to PennDot to investigate need for a sign in the West Pike Street, Meadowlands area. Roll Call: Mr. Spin – no; Mr. Friend – no. The motion was defeated 2-0.
- 22. <u>Truck</u> Decision for purchase of an International Truck and financing options are being researched for discussion at the next meeting.
- 23. <u>Parks and Recreation Van</u> The Board is looking into other options for transporting children registered in the summer parks activities in lieu of purchasing a van.
- 24. <u>LSA Proposed Changes</u> Mrs. Noble will prepare a Resolution for May 14, 2019 meeting opposing Representative Cook's proposal to divert shares from Local Municipalities.
- 25.<u>GIS</u> The Township Manager & Planner are working toward operational inhouse system usable for Police & CTVFD as well.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

<u>William Kiehl of 2782 N. Main Ext.</u> stated that South Strabane Township is proceeding with an upgrade of the WEWJA Pump Station and asked if Chartiers needs to take any action on our part of that process. The Township Solicitor will check into that.
