#### CYPHER & CYPHER – 2018 Audit:

Steven Cypher, CPA and Luke Rayle, CPA presented the 2018 Audit indicating that Chartiers Township is in a healthy financial state. They recommend that the Township consider changing accounting software as a means to alleviate reconciliation of out of balance fund.

<u>Richard Small of 1024 McGovern Road</u> asked the Board for clarification on the proposed Arnold Park plans as a Ballfield as opposed to grading and drainage for use as a multipurpose field that would benefit more usage options.

<u>James Moore of 249 Cherry Avenue</u> asked if the Phase I bids presented were the Lowest bids and Mrs. Noble verified it was the lowest .

- 2. A motion was made by Mr. Marcischak and seconded by Mr. Friend to award the Base Bid for the Arnold Baseball Field, Phase I, Add Alternate I for infield drainage to <u>John Zatolla Landscaping</u> of <u>Pittsburgh, PA</u> in the amount of <u>\$61,300.00</u> in accordance with the public bid opening of August 8, 2019 as recommended by the Township Engineer in her letter dated August 9, 2019. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0
  - b. A motion was made by Mr. Marcischak and seconded by Mr. Friend to reject all bids for the Arnold Baseball Field, Phase I, Add Alternate II for spreading topsoil to <u>John Zatolla Landscaping</u> of <u>Pittsburgh, PA</u> in the amount of <u>\$40,600.00</u> in accordance with the public bid opening of August 8, 2019 as recommended by the Township Engineer in her letter dated August 9, 2019. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0

  - b. Alex Paris (Contract A)–ongoing through the end of next week
  - c. Russel Standard (Contract C) completed seal coating; PAWC repairing water main break; fog seal will be spread to complete
  - d. Allison Hollow Rejuvenator Two separate contracts for Rejuvenator and plastic lines as needed.
- 3. <u>2019 Sewer Rehab</u> Lining Project was awarded; excavation bid openings next Thursday; CCTV quotes scheduled for fall.
- <u>CHJA Rate Amendment/Fee Increase/Planning Module Requirement</u> Mr. Liekar informed the Board that a mediation hearing is scheduled before Judge Lucas on November 10, 2019.

- <u>LSA Grant</u> The deadline for submission is moved up to September 25, 2019. There will be further discussion at the August 27, 2019 meeting as to a potential Township wide Act 537 plan submission
- 13. <u>Capital Projects Grant Opportunity</u> The Township Manager offered Senator Bartolotta's capital grant opportunities to consider projects for submission.
- 14. <u>WCATO Convention</u> The convention is scheduled for October 10, 2019 at the Hilton Garden Inn at Southpointe. PSATS is having the Fall Forum the same day as well as Friday, October 11, 2019.
- 15. <u>Clean Up Donation Request</u> Fern Sibert, coordinator of a volunteer roads right of ways clean-up group, submitted a donation request to assist them. Mrs. Noble will have that ready for the agenda at the next meeting.
- 16. License Plate Camera Request:
  - A motion was made by Mr. Marcischak and seconded by Mr. Friend authorizing the purchase of four (4) license late reader cameras from <u>Emerick Security Systems</u> in the amount of <u>\$1,814.37</u> as recommended by the Chief of Police in accordance with the Chartiers Township Purchasing Policy. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0.

- 17. <u>Meeting Room Tables</u> This will be prepared for action at the August 27, 2019 meeting.
- 18. Pressure Washer
  - A motion was made by Mr. Marcischak and seconded by Mr. Friend authorizing the purchase of an Industrial Duty Gas Skid Mount Hot Water Pressure Washer from <u>Grainger</u> via State Contract in the amount of \$<u>4,887.85</u> as recommended by the Director of Public Works in accordance with the Chartiers Township Purchasing Policy. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0.
- 19. Gazebo Railings / Rental Fees:
  - A motion was made by Mr. Marcischak and seconded by Mr. Friend authorizing the purchase of one (1) additional section of railing from Play 'N Go for the gazebo at the Community Center to provide a symmetrical appearance with the funds for the cost of the railing come from the CTCC fundraising, monetary donations & resources. All Supervisors voted yes. The motion carried. 2-0

Discussion ensued pertaining to options for establishing fees to cover rental costs based on use and various rental scenarios of the gazebo. This will be discussed further at the upcoming August 27, 2019 meeting.

<u>Hiland Moore of 1020 McGovern Road</u> expressed his appreciation for the improvements in Allison Park with the walking paths and commended Public Works for their work and upkeep.

<u>Clyde Clendaniel of 328 Windsor Circle</u> asked if something can be done to reduce the drop-off sections along McClane Farm Road. Mr. Jeffries will check that.
