A Message From the Chief of Police

Soon it will be time to put our snow shovels and ice scrapers away, and our attention will turn to home repairs and improvements. Unfortunately, those with less than honorable intentions also set out to exploit your desire to keep your property up to date. I can assure you with great confidence that these scammers will be out just as I continue to assure you that phone calls that you may receive from the "IRS" are not real.

The need to get the best deal on home repairs is understandable. A new roof or a new driveway can run thousands of dollars, and we would all like to get the work done for less. But, rogue contractors talk a good game and are persistent, they demand money up front and produce poor or incomplete work, or never return once they've been paid. Be careful when planning home improvements. Contractors are required to be licensed in Pennsylvania. When in doubt, refer to the Pennsylvania Attorney General website at http://hicsearch.attorneygeneral.gov/ to look up any contractor that you are considering. Another resource is the Angie's List website https://www.angieslist.com/ which contains contractor reviews and has recently become free to use. Lastly, reputable contractors rely heavily on word of mouth. Most likely there is someone you know and trust who has had some work done or knows someone that had work done who can provide you with the name of a good contractor. Be wary of the "contractor" who shows up at your door unannounced as these are usually roving groups who move from community to community, staying one step ahead of law enforcement as they move. When in doubt, you are encouraged to contact the Police Department before signing anything or releasing any funds.

Nice weather also brings the knock at the door of people purporting to sell anything from cleaning products to vacuum cleaners as well. Be aware that Chartiers Township does have an ordinance in place for soliciting where anyone who comes to your home is required to have an authorization from the Township to solicit. Contact 911 if someone does visit you without this written authorization. Be sure to provide your address, a description of the person(s) and any vehicle and their direction of travel. This will help the police to intercept the unregistered solicitor.

As most of you know Chartiers Township is not alone in the growing number of car break-ins. This is a crime of opportunity where the subject simply walks by a parked car and lifts the handle. If the car is locked, they move on; if not, they rummage for cash and other valuables in the vehicle. I, too, remember the days when we not only left our vehicles unlocked but our homes as well. Unfortunately, the world has changed. The people committing this type of crime are not looking to feed their hungry family, but to feed a drug habit, which is strong. If they can get \$2-\$3 from each of 20 cars on a street, it is enough to feed their habit for the night. Tomorrow, they move to the next street or the next neighborhood. A number of arrests have been made and our Department is in constant communication with neighboring police departments experiencing the same type of thefts, comparing notes and information obtained from each crime scene. These thieves are looking for a quick buck and as long as we make it easy for them we will continue to be victimized. Please remember to lock your doors, and don't be afraid to report any activity that you feel suspicious. As word gets around that the cars are locked in a neighborhood or the police show up every

time they walk down the street, others won't want to waste their time and move on to a community less diligent in protecting their homes and property.

Lastly, school will be out soon and children will be playing in their yards or riding their bicycles on neighborhood streets. Remember to slow down and abide by the stop signs. We receive numerous complaints about speeding and stop signs. But, as long as one of our officers is watching a stop sign, everyone suddenly becomes law-abiding and remembers to stop. As soon as the officer pulls away to patrol or answer a call, everyone suddenly forgets and hardly slows down. There are people who walk the neighborhoods with their children and dogs. Will you be able to stop if one of those children darts in front of your car, especially if you're distracted by your phone?

Remember, Chartiers Township is our home. We all bear some responsibility to keep it safe.

Improve Stormwater Management: Use a Rain Barrel!



During the most common rain event, where 1 inch of rain falls, the roof of a house may drain over 600 gallons of water across the shingles, into the gutters and down through the downspouts. This stormwater is often discharged onto an impervious material, i.e., concrete, asphalt, or a stone bed. An alternate and preferred method would be to discharge the water from the downspouts to a rain barrel.

Rain barrels help reduce the volume of runoff that reaches an impervious surface by storing it for later watering purposes or for release during times when the ground is not saturated. By capturing this water and releasing it when it is not raining, the amount of water directly entering local streams through runoff can be greatly reduced. It also provides for the first flush cleaning of the pollutants that are within the first inch of rainfall falling from a roof.

• \$75 res/\$100 non-res for Arnold Park • \$50 res/\$100 non-res for Allison Park.




Veterans Day Lunch



Off-Road Vehicles

Off-road vehicles are snowmobiles, and motor driven vehicles with two wheels and ATV's used for off-road use and not required to be licensed by the State.

All off-road vehicles <u>must be registered with Chartiers Township</u>. Forms may be obtained at the Police Department. Registration is good for five years. No owner of an off-road vehicle shall permit the operation of an unregistered off-road vehicle. The permit fee is \$5.00.

No off-road vehicle may be:

- Operated on private property without permission of the owner or on public property unless otherwise posted.
- Operated within 300 feet of any property line where permission has not been obtained.
- Operated within 500 feet of an occupied structure or residence unless the rider/owner owns said structure

Hours of operation for an off-road vehicle is 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM.

Violators, upon conviction by a Magistrate Judge, may be fined up to \$300.00 plus court costs per violation.

Be sensitive to other property owners and follow the rules for the operation of off-road vehicles.
