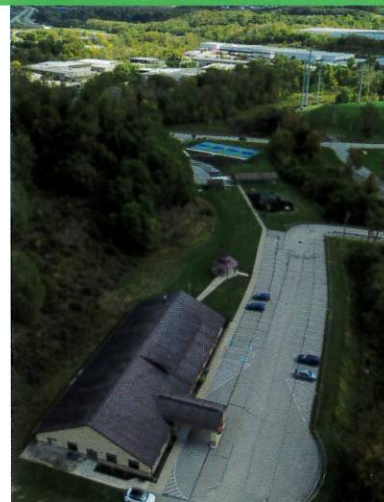


AMERICAN SPIRIT GRANT PROGRAM

Chartiers Township is pleased to announce that we have received an American Spirit Grant through the Washington County Tourism and Promotion Agency in promotion of the America 250 initiative to install a shade structure and seating at the newly constructed pickleball courts in Arnold Park.

The Township recently completed four pickleball courts at Arnold Park, which have quickly become a popular amenity and are already in high demand. The grant will allow us to add a shade shelter, benches, and picnic tables for players waiting for a court and for spectators watching the games.

These improvements will make the space more comfortable for residents and support future tournaments, lessons, and other pickleball activities. The shade structure will be built by the Chartiers Township Public Works Department this April.

- Recyclables must be in a clearly marked "RECYCLE" receptacle. It does not have to be the Township standard bin, but it must be marked.
- Recyclables in plastic / garbage bags will NOT be picked up. **NO PLASTIC BAGS** in the bin or containing recyclables.
- All recyclables can be in the same container
- Keep liquid and food out of your recyclables/ recycling container
- **ALL RECYCLING MUST BE PLACED ON THE CURB BY 6AM THE DATE OF YOUR COLLECTION**

Stay Informed, Stay Ready

The Washington County Department of Public Safety is proud to announce the launch of its new countywide emergency notification system, **Regroup**, designed to provide residents with timely alerts and critical information during emergencies.

The Regroup system will allow county officials to quickly communicate important updates related to severe weather, public safety incidents, road closures, and other emergency situations. Notifications can be delivered directly to residents through text messages, phone calls, and email, helping ensure the community receives vital information when it matters most.

"Providing accurate and timely information during emergencies is critical to keeping our residents safe," said county officials. "This new system will allow us to communicate more effectively with the public and ensure important alerts reach people as quickly as possible."

CHARTIERS TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS

The Chartiers Township Public Works Department is dedicated to maintaining our community's infrastructure and services. With just seven employees, the department handles maintenance for:

- 59 miles of roads
 - 205,300 feet of stormwater pipes and thousands of inlets
 - 197,200 feet of public sewer lines
 - Parks, the municipal complex, and the Community Center
- They also collaborate with Parks & Recreation, Code Enforcement, and the Police Department to enhance residents' quality of life.

Roadside Landscaping Maintenance

Property owners are responsible for maintaining roadside trees and landscaping. Overgrown vegetation can create safety hazards for pedestrians and motorists. Please ensure:

- Trees and shrubs are trimmed 1 foot behind the curb or pavement edge
- Branches are cleared to a minimum height of 13 feet
- Corner properties maintain clear sightlines at intersections

Sewer Line Responsibility

Public Works frequently responds to calls about sewage backups. Residents are responsible for their lateral line *from their home to the main sewer line*. If a blockage is suspected, Public Works will check the mainline first. If it is clear, residents should contact a plumber to resolve the issue.

Work Zone Safety Reminder

When driving through work areas, please **slow down** and use caution. Your cooperation helps keep our crews safe as they work to improve our community.

Items NOT Accepted:

- ⊗ Concrete, brick, asphalt, roofing
- ⊗ Items containing Freon (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, etc.)
- ⊗ Auto parts
- ⊗ Building materials (plaster, drywall, wood, construction debris, etc.)
- ⊗ Household hazardous waste (paints, cleaners, CFL bulbs, automotive products, garden chemicals, batteries, TVs, computers, etc.)

Property owners are responsible for ensuring safe, unobstructed access to items set out for collection.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF:

As spring arrives, many of us are getting back outside to clean up our yards, start projects, and enjoy the warmer weather. This is a great time to also refresh our safety habits. A few simple precautions can prevent emergencies:



Be Careful with Outdoor Fires

Spring brush and debris can ignite quickly. Follow township regulations, avoid burning on dry or windy days, and always keep water or a fire extinguisher close by.

Check Your Equipment

Before using lawnmowers, trimmers, or grills, make sure they are clean and in good working order. Old fuel, leaks, or damaged parts can create fire hazards.

Prepare for Spring Storms

Heavy rain and strong winds can arrive with little warning. Clear gutters, secure loose outdoor items, and review your family's emergency plan.

Refresh Your Home Safety Plan

Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and replace batteries if needed. Review escape plans with your family — practice makes a difference in an emergency.

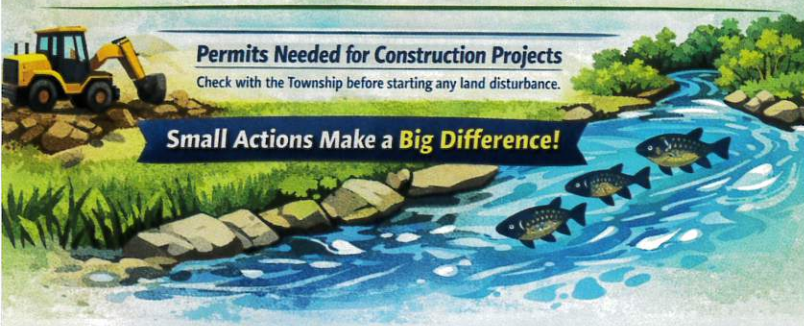

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF ENGINEERING AND PLANNING:

Stormwater Matters

When it rains or snow melts, stormwater runoff flows over roofs, driveways, streets, and yards, carrying pollutants into storm drains and local waterways. Proper stormwater management helps reduce flooding, prevent erosion, and protect roads, streams, and neighboring properties.

Uncontrolled runoff can cause flooded basements and roadways, damage infrastructure, and pollute streams with sediment, oil, fertilizers, and debris. Township stormwater systems are designed to manage this runoff, but they rely on proper maintenance and responsible actions by residents.

You can help by:

- Keeping storm drains clear of leaves and debris
- Directing downspouts away from foundations and toward grassy areas
- Never dumping materials into storm drains
- Using fertilizers sparingly and sweeping excess from paved surfaces
- Maintaining private drainage features such as swales or rain gardens

Many construction and grading projects require permits to ensure stormwater is properly managed during and after construction. These requirements protect neighboring properties and public infrastructure. Stormwater management is a shared responsibility. Small actions at home make a big difference in protecting our community and local waterways.

SOLICITATION IN CHARTIERS TOWNSHIP:

With warmer weather approaching, residents may notice an increase in door-to-door solicitation throughout the Township.

Individuals or companies wishing to solicit in Chartiers Township are required to obtain a permit from the Township Office prior to going door-to-door. Approved solicitors are issued identification, which should be presented upon request.

Allowable solicitation hours are Monday through Saturday from 10:00 AM to dusk. Solicitation is not permitted outside of these hours. *However, please note that certain, non-sales door-to-door solicitations are protected and do not require a solicitation permit, including religious or political solicitations as well as minors on fundraising campaigns.*

The Township also maintains a Do Not Knock / No Solicitation List, which is provided to solicitors when permits are issued. Residents who wish to be included on the list may contact the Township Office or complete the "No Solicitation List Registration form" available on the Township website.

Residents are encouraged to:

- Ask to see a Township-issued permit.
- Never feel pressured to make an immediate decision.
- Avoid sharing personal or financial information at the door.
- Contact the Township Office if they have questions or concerns about a solicitor's legitimacy.

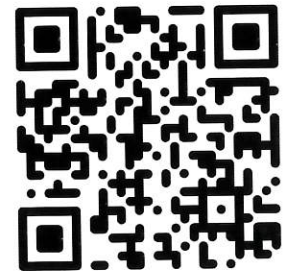
