### A Message From the Chief of Police

We again begin to prepare for another welcomed spring after a rather unusual winter in a rather unusual year. It is now time to get outside to work in the yard, on the house or just take a walk and take in that refreshing spring air. I would ask that during the time you are out be aware of what is going on around your neighborhood. No one knows your area better than you and if there is something or someone out of place, please contact the Police via 911. "IF YOU SEE SOMETHING SAY SOMETHING".

We begin getting more and more people soliciting within the Township at this time of year and do have an ordinance in place to regulate it as much as the law allows. ALL must present a

Township permit if requested and we would strongly urge you to request to see it as soon as you are contacted. If the person does not have a permit, please contact 911 so that a Police officer can immediately come into that area and investigate. If the person does have a permit, it



is up to you if you would like to hear what they have to say. If you request that they leave and they continue, again contact the Police via 911.

The Department continues to provide Vacation/Home checks. If you are going to be away from your home for an extended period of time, come fill out one of our forms that can be found in the Police Department and municipal lobby. An Officer will check your home once during each shift or three times a day. We would urge all our residents to take advantage of this service, being just another advantage of you having a local Police Department.

Many homes within the Township have integral garages which are outfitted with an electric garage door opener which gives you access into your home with the click of a button. Sometimes we are so dependent on entering our homes this way we fail to carry keys. What do you do if the electric is off or the battery in the opener fails? A key should always be carried or provided to a family member or neighbor for just this type of emergency. They do sell devices such as lock boxes that mount to your home that can securely hold a key if you have no other options. With the summer storms that are certain to roll through our area power outages are sure to take place. Be prepared.







## Help to Keep Our Waterways Clean

Thousands of feet of storm sewer pipes and swales are located throughout Chartiers Township to convey and control stormwater runoff. Much of this storm water infrastructure is located below the ground surface and so we don't think about our above ground actions impacting it. However, storm runoff that enters the storm sewer eventually will be conveyed to a surface stream or the ground water system. The quality of this storm runoff needs to be protected, as we may use it for recreation such as swimming in a downstream location, or for consumption in our homes when it is withdrawn using ground water wells.

#### You can do your part to keep the storm sewer system clean by implementing the following practices:

- · Collect used engine fluids and recycle.
- Repair drip leaks from vehicles as soon as you discover them. These leaks typically leave their mark on paved areas; water runoff will carry them to storm systems.
- Never dump used cleaning and household products or engine fluids into a storm drain or a drain that flows to a basement sump pump.
- Never dump used cleaning and household products or engine fluids on the ground surface.
- Use garden and lawn care products like fertilizers and pesticides in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Clean up and dispose of pet waste properly, ensuring it doesn't make its way into the storm sewer collection system.



## **Tax Collection Changes**

Please be advised, effective January 4, 2021, Jordan Tax Service, Inc. was appointed the Deputy Tax Collector for the Township of Chartiers. All 2021 Township and School Real Estate Tax payments shall be mailed to their office; an envelope will be provided with your tax statement unless your mortgage company is set up to receive your tax bills. Township tax bills will be mailed March 1st and due by April 30th at discount. Jordan Tax Service will hold office hours at the Township at the beginning and end of the discount period. 

# Spring Clean-Up: May 17 — May 21

Chartiers Township is offering a week long waste collection effort again this spring! Curbside collection will occur the week of May 17th – May 21st. There is a schedule of Township Streets and day for collection along with a color coded map on the Township website and Facebook page for reference. Please note that generally, the hauler will progress across the Township from east to west.

#### The following items WILL NOT be picked up:

- · Auto tires
- Automobile parts
- · Dirt, bricks, stones and concrete
- Refrigerators, air conditions units and appliances which have not been certified for removal of chlorofluorocarbons.
- Cans exceeding in 40 lbs.
- · Carpet not cut- (must be bundled and tied in 4' lengths)
- Paint-liquid
- E-Waste material: electronic devices, TVs, computers, printers, etc.
