#### A Message From the Chief of Police

On behalf of the Chartiers Township Police Department, I would like to welcome all our new residents and thank all of our current residents who have supported our police department over the years. My name is Steve Horvath and I recently, as of February, have received the honor of being promoted to be your new Chief of Police. I was born and raised in the township and attended and graduated from the Chartiers-Houston High School. My son Steven and my daughter Ashley also both graduated from CHHS. I played baseball for LaRoche University and after receiving my bachelor's degree from there, I attended the Allegheny County Police Academy and received my police certification. I was hired by Chief Eugene Oliver in 1992 where I started my police career with Chartiers Township and am happy to say that I will celebrate the start of my 31st year in February. I worked up through the ranks in the department holding positions of Sergeant, Sergeant Detective, Lieutenant, and now Chief. I was the department's first DARE officer for over the past 25 years. If you can't find me at work, you probably will find me supporting our school sporting events, school events, or community events. I believe in community policing and feel that our department does a wonderful job interacting with our community. I must say that I along with our officers are very proud of the continued letters, phone calls, and positive comments that we receive from our residents.

Our department consists of 13 sworn Officers, who continue to be cross trained in different areas and continue to attend classes so that we can give you the best service possible.

In addition to answering complaints, providing traffic details, and investigating crimes, our department offers other free services for our township as well. We offer the following service:

- Drug Take Back Program: Two times a year we take in unwanted, old, or unused medications so that they can be disposed of properly to avoid them being misused or abused. There is also a container located in the entrance of the main township building where you can drop off those medications anytime.
- Vacation Check: Residents can fill out a form and our officers will check your residence each shift while you are away and if any problems arise, they will contact you and your emergency designee.
- DAR:. An officer attends the 6th grade at both the Allison Elementary School and the 5th grade at Central Christian Academy to instruct the students on the dangers of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, bullying, social media, etc. in this Drug Abuse Resistance Education program. The program also emphasizes how to make positive decisions and understanding consequences to your decisions. It is a great partnership with the schools, bringing students, parents, and the police department together.
- Child Restraint System: We have officers who are certified to properly install car and booster seats for children.
- **Fingerprinting**: Our officers can, at no cost to residents, fingerprint you for certifications that you need for a job or application. This does NOT include background checks for working with children.
- Speakers: Our officers are willing to come and speak with your organization and to answer questions that your group or organization might have.
- Swift Reach: This is a phone system that as residents you voluntarily sign up for. It allows us to call residents with emergency information such as evacuations, traffic problems, road closings, etc.

And in a final note, I just would like to recognize Chief James M. Horvath and Sgt. Harry Miller on their retirement from service of the CTPD. They were essential components of the infrastructure of our department and a big part of the success here at the department.

In closing, I just want to thank you all for your continued support and I encourage you to try and meet our officers any chance you get. Our office is open 24/7 and 365 days a year. Even during the COVID epidemic, our department remained open, and no patrols were ever missed. We appreciate those of you who show your support with the blue light on your residences and invite you to visit our Facebook page so that you can see some of the events our officers attended. We as a department we will continue to strive and bring you the best service we can.

# The Township has scheduled curbside Fall Leaf Collection for the following MONDAYS:

#### **Department of Public Works**

The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining 59 miles of township roads and streets over an area of 24.61 square miles. The Department performs paving, street maintenance and repair, snow removal, street sign replacement, storm sewer maintenance, leaf pickup, mowing along roads, and street sweeping with our crew of 7. All parks and recreational facilities are also maintained by the Department. In addition, the Public Works Department maintains and services its own equipment and all police vehicles.

The Public Works Department has an ambitious road program, which includes, upgrading, resurfacing, and patching township roads and streets. This program is based annually on priority and, needs and funding.

Remember to shovel to the right of your driveway facing the road, as plows clear from the left. This helps to reduce the amount of snow pushed back into your driveway during plowing. Throwing, shoveling, or plowing snow from sidewalks or driveway into the street is prohibited.

The Public Works Department would like to remind all residents to please slow down while traveling in work areas.

The Public Works Department hours are from 6:45 am - 2:45 pm Monday thru Friday and can be reached at 724-745-3415.



#### Fire Department Fall 2022 Update

Greetings from your 100% Volunteer Fire Department.

This has been an extremely busy you for us. For the third year in a row, we will eclipse a new record number of emergency calls for service.

One of the highlights of this year has been an overhaul of our 1992 Ford F-350 Brush Truck



Even though we only respond to a handful of brush fires each year, we felt that it was important to maintain this capability in our Department. As the pictures below show, we removed the pump and fire body from the chassis, replaced it with an aluminum flatbed and a brush skid unit. We're still in the process of finishing up the rebuild, but expect to have it complete by the first of October.

Our membership has rallied around this project and thanks to the expertise of our Engineers and the willingness of the rest of our group, we have shown that we continue to be good stewards of the funds entrusted us by you from our Annual Fund Drive. This project has a total cost of less than \$31,000, but a complete replacement of the truck, including cab and chassis would have been in excess of \$100,000.

The sequence of pictures to the right follows the truck through its transformation to where it is today.

As always, thank you for your support in our Fund Drive. Projects such as this would not be possible without your help.


