

Clear Streets, Clean Streams: A Fall Reminder

As the leaves begin to fall, please remember that what we do in our yards can impact our entire community. Leaves and other yard debris should never be swept or blown into storm drains, inlets, or streams. When this happens, drains can clog, increasing the risk of neighborhood flooding, and decomposing leaves in streams can harm water quality and aquatic life.

Residents are encouraged to collect and bag leaves for curbside pickup from your hauler, compost them at home, or take advantage of township leaf collection services. By managing leaves responsibly, we can all help keep our neighborhoods safe, our waterways healthy, and our community beautiful.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE:

Welcome to our new residents and businesses, and a big hello to everyone who makes our community special! We are a 24/7 police department and are here to assist you. For complaints or concerns, please call 911—this is the fastest way to reach an officer.

This year, our officers began using body cameras, which work alongside our in-car video systems for investigations and training. You may also notice our patrol vehicles are getting a fresh look. Officer Brittan Laird completed his probation year, and Officer Jeff Toth joined the team in May.

As the fall and winter seasons approach, remember that parking on roadways is not permitted unless you have a driveway. This ensures clear roads for traffic, emergency vehicles, and snow removal. For short-term parking needs during events, contact the township office.

Our department continues to provide programs like DARE, vacation checks, drug take-back events, and community presentations. Make sure your house numbers are visible for emergency responders and sign up for RAVE ALERT on the township website to receive important notifications.

Thank you for your continued support—through kind words, treats, and encouragement. We wish you and your family a safe and joyful holiday season!



PAUL MILLER'S LAW-

EFFECTIVE JUNE 5, 2025 Keep your eyes on the road.

Your safety is in your hands

IN MEMORY OF

PAUL MILLER JR.

The law is named for Paul Miller, Jr., who was tragically killed in a crash with a tractor trailer in 2010 in Monroe County, as the result of a distracted driver who reached for their phone while driving. Since his death, Paul's mother Eileen Miller has become a national advocate for stronger laws to curb distracted driving.


"Paul Miller's Law" - prohibits the use of hand-held devices while driving, even while stopped temporarily due to traffic, a red light, or other momentary delay.

Under Paul Miller's Law, drivers can still use their phones if they are using hands-free technology, to make phone calls, use a GPS, and listen to music or if the driver moves the vehicle to the side of or off a highway and halts in a location where the vehicle can safely remain stationary.



Under Paul Miller's Law, drivers can still use their phones to alert emergency responders (9-1-1 or *11 on the Pennsylvania Turnpike)







If a driver is convicted of homicide by vehicle and driving while distracted, they may be sentenced up to an additional five years in prison.

CHARTIERS TOWNSHIP PUBLIC WORKS

The Chartiers Township Public Works Department is dedicated to maintaining our community's infrastructure and services. With just <u>seven</u> employees, the department handles maintenance for:

- 57 miles of roads
- 205,300 feet of stormwater pipes and thousands of inlets
- 197,200 feet of public sewer lines
- Parks, the municipal complex, and the Community Center

They also collaborate with Parks & Recreation, Code Enforcement, and the Police Department to enhance residents' quality of life.

Driveway Snow Removal Quick Tip:

It's nearly impossible to prevent plowed snow from accumulating in your driveway, but to help minimize it, shovel snow to the right of your driveway to reduce the amount redirected by passing plow trucks. Clearing an area to the left of your driveway can further reduce snow buildup.

SNOW REMOVAL GUIDELINES

Snow routes are prioritized as follows for emergency, safety, and traffic reasons:

- School bus routes, hills, and curves
- Collector and arterial roads
- Residential streets and alleys (These are the last to be plowed.)

Please remember that PennDOT is responsible for clearing state roads within the Township.

Important Reminders:

- Do not shovel snow into the street or sidewalk. This
 creates a safety hazard and may result in fines.
 Additionally, avoid piling snow in front of fire
 hydrants.
- Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after snowfall, sleet, or freezing rain ends.
- On-street parking is prohibited in Chartiers
 Township, especially during snow events, to allow
 for road clearing. Please also remove any
 moveable items from the roadway before a snow
 event, such as trash cans, recycling bins, portable
 basketball hoops, backstops, and soccer nets.


